**Parking Legend**

The use of UNI parking facilities, except metered areas, requires registration and parking permit at all times.

- G parking**  
Parking permitted from 7 a.m. to 1 a.m.
- A parking**  
Parking permitted from 7 a.m. to 1 a.m.
- B parking**  
Parking permitted from 7 a.m. to 1 a.m.
- C parking**, 24 hour parking permitted
- C Preferred North or South - parking**  
24 hour parking permitted.  
EXCEPTION: Move in week (week before beginning of the Fall Semester)  
NO OVERNIGHT PARKING & MAX TIME LIMIT.
- R parking**: 24 hour parking permitted. R permit not valid in C or CP lots
- Metered Lots**
- D parking**  
For use with a valid handicap permit/plate and valid UNI parking permit.
- Lot used for scheduled UNI home football games paid parking. Vehicles with current UNI parking permits may be required to pay posted rates.
- Other areas as posted. No overnight parking 1 a.m. to 7 a.m.

- Loading zone**  
All permit holders may use for specified time period
- Service area**  
For use by university vehicles & vehicles displaying a valid Service permit. Enforced at all times.
- Motorcycle parking**  
Motorcycles are required to display a valid MC permit and must be parked in motorcycle areas
- Handicapped-accessible entries**
- Disabled Parking**: Valid handicapped permit or a temporary UNI handicapped permit and valid UNI parking permit required.
- Parking Meters**
- Pay-By-Phone meters**  
Locations via the ParkMobile App where you see the sticker. Time restrictions may apply.
- TP Ticket Patron**
- University Police and Parking Office**
- Extended road closures**

Except for meters & stalls designated for a specific permit/use within the lot (some of which are enforced 24/7)... You may/may not park in these designated lots M-F, 7 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Stalls and areas with each lot may be posted for a specific use, specific permit, or time restricted.

Disabled parking stalls may be used by any person with a valid handicap placard/plate AND current UNI parking permit, except R. After 4 p.m. an R permit is also valid. No overnight parking in handicap stalls unless otherwise posted.

Building numberings begin at the north end of campus and continue to the south.

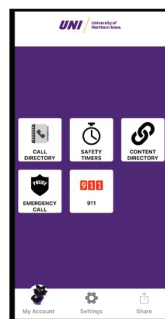
### ParkMobile Pay-By-Phone
